A few kind neighbors have asked questions during the course construction, so I thought I'd share some quick Q&A:

Q: Is the rumor true that you are going to flip the property / divide the property / sell the property / do something other than what you are doing?

A: No, the rumors are not true. We're launching a disc golf course on it. We have no plans to divide it or sell it. We hope to run a successful business on it, preserving it as green space and providing health-promoting recreation in the community.

Q: How much will cost be to play?

A: There will be a modest greens fee. I will be announcing this on the FB page to the disc golf community in the coming weeks. If you're a disc golfer, subscribe to the FB page to learn more.

Q: Will discs go in my yard? Will golfers come in my yard?

A: Just like when it was a ball golf course, and the occasional golf ball would end up in your yard, there is a chance of a stray disc, too. But we have done things to minimize this happening. The course has been designed so that stray disc swill angle inward toward the greens for the majority of cases, so stray discs going out of bounds will be hopefully minimal. Also, prior to play, we require all disc golfers read and sign the course rules. The course rules state that neighbor's yards are off limits, and if a disc goes into a yard, that the golfer should report it to the clubhouse, and not disturb the neighbor in any way. If a disc does end up in your yard, you can toss it over into the greens area and it will get picked up and returned to the clubhouse, or you can drop it off at the clubhouse, too. Most golfers write their contact info on the backs of discs, to help course owners reunite them if they do get separated, so we will notify any lost disc owners that their disc was turned in.

Q: Will you be protecting the ponds and the septic field?

A: Yes, absolutely. We're working with the county expert to understand exactly what we need to do to keep them in great shape. He pre-okayed all our plans for construction in that area, for tees, baskets, signs, and fences. Likewise with the septic field, we've consulted with AquaTest who manage the system about how to safely work around the drainfield without affecting them. Just like all the neighbors who live around the golf course, we want to ensure that it's maintained and taken care of, too.

Q: What is Disc Golf? Can anyone play?

A: Disc golf is popular with players of all ages, from pre-teen and college-age, adults, and active seniors. If you are new to disc golf as a sport, here is a primer:

Disc golf is a sport that has similar gameplay to traditional ball golf, in that you play through the fairways, try to make par, and usually complete against your own best score.

In disc golf, you advance the fairway by throwing a flying disc, and you aim for an elevated metal basket. The obstacles that make it challenging might be trees, terrain, slope of the ground, or risk of going into the roughs. You often use different discs that are designed for going long distances, curving, or going short distances.

Each hole begins at a tee pad which is where you stand for the first throw. Most holes have a choice of long tees and short tees, depending on what kind of challenge you're looking for. Each hole has a basket, which is a shoulder-level goal that you're aiming to get your disc to land in. Suspended above the basket is a cluster of chains, which helps stop the disc in the air and help it drop into the basket.

You stand on the tee, and throw a disc down the fairway toward the basket. If you don't get a hole in one, then you stand where you disc landed, and throw again (sometimes with a different disc). If your disc lands in a rough, you stand on the fairway closest to where you went out-of-bounds, and throw from there. You tally the number of throws it takes you to get a basket, mark your score, and move on to the next hole.

Septic System

Annual Residential Septic Inspections will be happening in late August or early September. Previously we have asked owners to provide the Board copies of their septic pumping and repair receipts. Some owners didn't think it was necessary and we were overstepping. What we are trying to do is compile "an at a glance" overview of each owners septic system. If a septic problem ever occurs this at a glance file of information could save time for the homeowner. No need for them to find the last date their septic was pumped, or repaired, or when the last problem happened.

This just came up 2 weeks ago, an owner was having an alarm situation several times a week. We had asked him questions about pumping his septic tanks and he wasn't certain when it was done. He thought maybe he had pumped last year, and possibly had work done. Busy people don't have time to keep track of when their septic system was last pumped. Now he has to spend time finding this information. If we would have been provided a copy of his receipt, he wouldn't have to give it a second thought. Please keep this in mind next time you have maintenance done to your system. We just want to be helpful!
